Family & Community Involvement

Angel Tree – Families donate food for Thanksgiving and Christmas presents for students and families in need. Backpack Buddies – Providing weekly food to families in need.

Boosterthon – Schoolwide fundraiser that focuses on character development. Yielded over \$32,000 this year. **Business Partners** – Partners donate for the school's leadership initiative.

Career Fair – Annual event bringing in 30 business and community members to share their careers with the students. Gardening Initiative – Schoolwide standards-based gardening initiative that focuses on delivering instruction in an engaging manner while giving back to the community. HELP of Beaufort – Food Collection Drive for the community.

LINKS – Ánnual program for military impacted students. **Military Family Liaison Consultant** – A licensed mental health professional working with military students and families.

School Renewal Goals

- 1. The percentage of students scoring "met" or "exceeds" on the SCREADY ELA in grades 3-5 will increase 2% (from 72.5% to 74.5%) by the end of the 2023-2024 school year. *Goal revised since goal was met prior to the end of the 5-year plan.
- 2. The percentage of students in grades 1 and 2 scoring at or above the 50th percentile will increase by 5.0% in the area of math by the end of the 2023-2024 school year (81%; Spring 2019).
- 3. In the area of self-efficacy, as measured by our Panorama survey, students in grades 3-5 who believe they can succeed in achieving academic outcomes will increase from 63% to 75% by the end of the 2023-2024 school year.
- 4. By the end of the 2023-2024 school year, CES will achieve STEM certification with 100% certified faculty members incorporating STEM within the classroom.

Innovative Learning & Resources

Artsonia — Coosa student artwork is displayed online in a Student Art Gallery at artsonia.com. Our gallery continues to grow. Currently, there are more than 19,500 works of student art published on our Artsonia gallery. We have had almost 55,000 visitors to the site. For busy families and family members far away, it is a great way to see what our students at Coosa are doing in the art room.

Brain Boosters — A 1^{st} and 2^{nd} grade curriculum resource that encourages critical thinking and problem solving.
