## Interim Performance Goals

1. The percentage of students scoring at or above the 50<sup>th</sup> percentile as measured by Spring MAP (or iReady) will increase from a baseline of 76% to 81% in the area of math and from 62.7% to 69.5% in the area of ELA.

2. The percentage of students scoring Met or Exceeds on the SC Ready ELA in Grades 3-5 will increase to a minimum of 80% in ELA and Math.

3. In the Spring of 2024, at least 80% of students will rate themselves as having a strong sense of self-efficacy.

4. By the end of the 2023-2024 school year, CES will achieve STEM certification with 100% of certified faculty members incorporating STEM and Project Lead The Way Curriculum within classrooms.

## Innovative Learning & Resources

Artsonia — Coosa student artwork is displayed online in a Student Art Gallery at <u>artsonia.com</u>. Our gallery continues to grow. Currently, there are more than 24,400 works of student art published on our Artsonia gallery. We have had almost 55,000 visitors to the site. For busy families and family members far away, it is a great way to see what our students at Coosa are doing in the art room.

**Brain Boosters** — A 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade curriculum resource that encourages critical thinking and problem solving.

Gifted and Talented Education (GATE) — Classes designed to challenge qualifying  $3^{rd}$ ,  $4^{th}$ , and  $5^{th}$  grade students.

**Instructional Coach** — Our instructional coach focuses on teacher professional development and teaching "best practices."

**Literacy Intervention Teachers** — Two certified teachers provide intensive small group and individual reading instruction for students needing support. We also have three additional interventionists that provide intervention weekly.

Math Interventionist- A certified teacher provides small group and individual math instruction to students in need of support.
